## CATALOG OF NASA LOCAL POST ISSUES

For the past several years, space collecting has been right up among the leaders of topical collecting and the largest part of space collecting is that of space covers. Then, if the rapidly-growing field of local post collecting is added, one has a collecting area that continues to be exciting.

The Space City Cover Society has been involved in both of these areas since 1967 and this may qualify for the title "longest continuous operator of a space-topic local post". The title is really beside the point. What matters is that we have tried to give wide coverage to the field of history-reflecting space covers and to make the covers have that "something extra" with the local post.

We hope YOU, the collector, will find the catalog of interest. Whether or not you collect the issues themselves, we will consider it an honor if you add this publication to your philatelic library.

## NASA LOCAL POST - HOW IT BEGAN

We thought you might like to know a bit about the background of the Space City Cover Society, as well as its aims and purposes. Because of the importance of Houston as a Space Center -- it is the home of the Lyndon B. Johnson Space Center (previously named the Manned Spacecraft Center) -- it was inevitable that philatelic space enthusiasts would get together and form a society. We were organized shortly before the untimely deaths of astronauts Grissom, White and Chaffee. We organized under the name of the Space City Philatelic Society but ultimately changed it to Space City Cover Society due to a chain of events.

When word was received of the tragic death of our first Apollo team, our Society wrestled with itself as to whether or not we should have some covers canceled and we decided that in the interest of other and future space collectors that we do so. However, when we attempted to get a "NASA" station cancel we were informed that none was available as all mail in the Houston area -- and this includes NASA -- is canceled at the main Houston Post Office in downtown Houston.

It was at this point that our Society decided that the best and proper way to fill this philatelic void was to create a NASA Local Post and cancel, which is permissible under postal regulations. It was decided to do this for any events with a space tie-in and most of these have been done for Houston events only, but in some others, for events outside of the Houston area.

It should be pointed out, for the beginner especially, that our NASA Local Post in no way is connected with the National Aeronautics and Space Administration. It should also be pointed out, that the NASA locals are not U. S. postage, but a local post issue, and are used on cover only when there is the regular first class rate of U. S. postage used and properly canceled at a U. S. Post Office.

## WHY COLLECT SPACE CITY COVER SOCIETY COVERS?

As you can see from the listing of those covers containing the NASA Local Post issues, we have covered the entire space field for the collector. When U. S. space stamps have been available (the first class rate at the time of the event) we have used them. We have always tried whenever possible to use only the U. S. Post Office machine cancel rather than a hand cancel. That way, the collector does not have to worry about whether or not the covers are genuine. In some cases only the hand cancel was available and it had to be used. On our SCCS covers, when we use other than a government stamped envelope, we always use a 25% rag bond envelope to assure the collector of a quality cover that will stand the test of time as to less chance of turning color.

## SOUVENIR SHEETS

Once you have gone over this complete listing of the NASA Local Post, one thing should stand out clearly...and that is that you won't find the issues perforated and imperforate. We have tried to be extra careful in making sure that every cover that contains a NASA Local has only a normal copy. We have never issued them in either sheet form or singly in imperforate condition and to our knowledge, none has slipped out that would be classified as a "printing error".

## FIRST DAY COVERS OF NASA LOCAL POST ISSUES

Some collectors want covers of local post issues only if they are the first day of use of the local post itself. Any of our covers that have a catalog number means that they are a first day cover of that particular local. An example of this would be Apollo 12. NASA Local number A-9-NLP was used on covers dated November 19, 1969 and November 20, 1969 but only the one for November 19 would be considered a first day of issue of the local. However, all covers in this listing do contain a NASA Local issue and cancel.



## PRICES

Many long-time collectors will attest to the validity of the higher prices on our early covers. Most of the early Space City Cover Society covers were done in quantities of 100 to 400 and those that contain the NASA Local have been sought after not only by the space collector but also by the collector of local posts. That plus the fact, that our early covers were issued just when space cover collecting was really coming of age, and every month saw an increase in the number of collectors.

Any of our covers with the price enclosed in parenthesis and marked "NIS" means that they are not in stock. In fact, we want to buy any of those covers and offer 60% of the price indicated. The prices shown are what we consider a fair retail value and not an inflated catalog value. Any of those not marked "NIS" are available from us at the price indicated. This is also true of the price shown for any souvenir sheet.

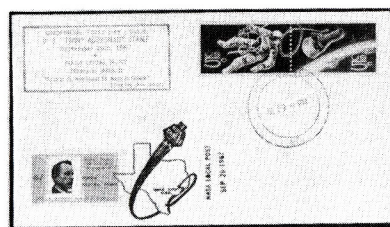
The souvenir sheets are available only in the complete sheets. The NASA Local has been offered that way from the very first issue and we certainly want to keep faith with the many collectors that have supported the SCCS cover program.

All prices are subject to change without notice but we will certainly try to maintain the price for as long as possible. It might be well to point out that most all of the covers in this listing were available at the time of original issue for only 50¢ to 60¢ each. And that is true of even the early ones.

## HOW TO ORDER

Use any sheet of paper (but 8 1/2 x 11" would be best) as your order blank. It should contain your full name and address, quantity of each item wanted, catalog number, date of item, and whether the item is a cover or souvenir sheet, and the price. Send the order along with your remittance (check or money order) to Space City Cover Society, P. O. Box 53545, Houston, Texas 77052. Be sure and include 25¢ with your order for postage and handling and one addressed, gummed label with the order will be appreciated.

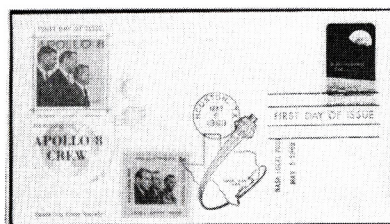


Type "1"

## SOUVENIR SHEETS:

Number FD-1-NLP is same format as "Mercury Series" number M-1-NLP, except picture is of Edward H. White II. Number FD-2-NLP is same format as "Special Events Series" and has margin inscriptions at top and bottom of sheet. Numbers FD-3-NLP, FD-4-NLP and FD-5-NLP are same format as "Special Events Series", with margin inscriptions on all four sides. Number FD-6-NLP is vertical format with ten horizontal 5¢ locals in each sheet. Margin inscriptions appear on the left and right side of the sheet.

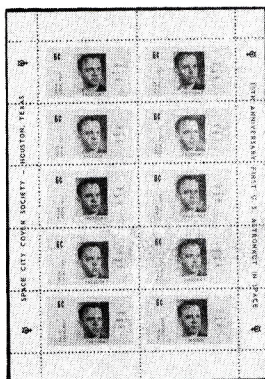

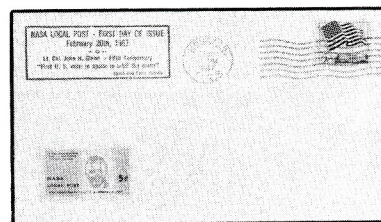

### SOUVENIR SHEETS:

On the Project Mercury Anniversary commemoratives, there are two different types of souvenir sheets. Type "A" is horizontal format with nine 5¢ locals per sheet. There is an inscription at the top and bottom of the sheet. Type "B" is vertical format with ten 6¢ locals per sheet; however the locals within the sheet are horizontal format and inscription is on the left and right side of the sheet.

Type "A" includes numbers M-1-NLP through M-6-NLP and Type "B" includes M-8-NLP through M-13-NLP. Number M-7-NLP contains twelve 5¢ locals, diamond-shaped, with sheet layout similar to those illustrated on "Special Event" locals.

### COVERS:

All of the covers with NASA Local Post numbers M-1-NLP through M-13-NLP are considered First Day covers of the NASA Local. This would also be true of the three varieties listed below.

### PRICES:

All souvenir sheets and covers are available at the prices indicated except those in parenthesis and marked "NIS" (not in stock). We do not have those but the price shown is what we consider a fair retail price. ## GEMINI Anniversary



The souvenir sheets are horizontal format with margin inscriptions on the left and right side. Each sheet contains twelve of the 5¢ locals.



All of the covers are as the one above and each has its individual matching cachet.

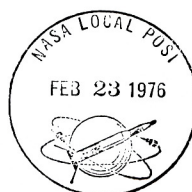
Since each of the ten Gemini flights carried two astronauts aboard the spacecraft, each astronaut was honored for his particular flight with a NASA Local Post commemorative. Thus, there are two covers in each set honoring the Gemini missions. In the case of Gemini 4, there are three covers to the set. Two of them are for each of the two mission astronauts and the other honors Dr. Robert R. Gilruth. At that time he was Director of the Manned Spacecraft Center in Houston. It was on June 3, 1970 that MSC became the Mission Control Center for all U. S. manned space flights.

From our first issue up through and including the ALT Space Shuttle flights at Edwards, California, we have used three different types of cancels. They are illustrated below:





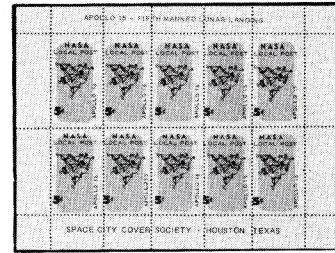

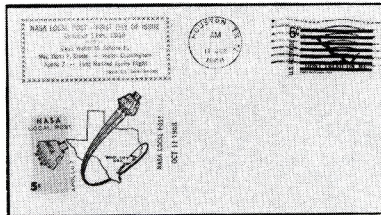

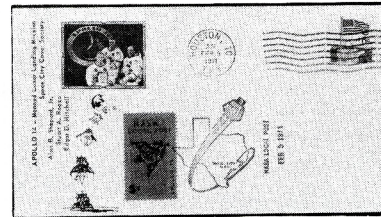

## SOUVENIR SHEETS:

For the Apollo missions, three different types of sheets were used. All were bi-colored, with margin inscriptions on the top and bottom, horizontal format. The locals within the sheets are all verticle format and of 5¢ value. Type "A" features a rendition of the Apollo craft. Type "B" has the top row of five featuring the Apollo craft and the bottom row of five featuring the Lunar Module. Type "C" features the Lunar Module. Catalog numbers A-3-NLP, A-7-NLP and A-10-NLP all have layouts similar to the souvenir sheets pictured in the "Special Events" section. All three of these sheets have locals that are of the 5¢ value.

\* NOTE The Apollo 10 "Splashdown" item is a card size 3 1/4 x 5 1/2", yellow stock, with the local imprinted directly on the card in yellow and black. Value is 5¢ and the design is Type "A"

## COVERS:

Not all of the covers listed below would be considered "First Day of Issue" for the NASA Local but all covers listed do contain the NASA Local and commemorative cancel. This would be true of those such as "Apollo 14 Moon Liftoff" and "Apollo 14 Splashdown". Covers for Apollo 7 and 8 have a rubber-stamped cachet, while those of Apollo 9 and later are all printed.

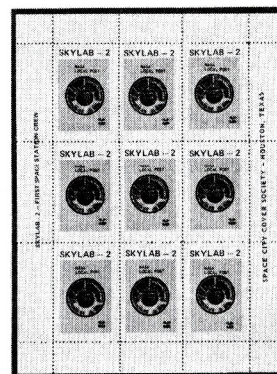
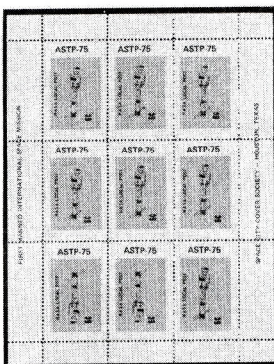

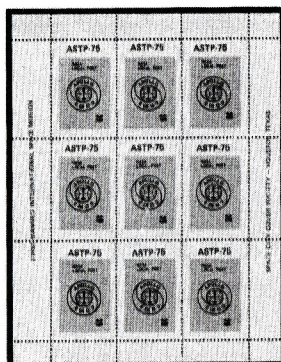
### SOUVENIR SHEETS:

Two different types of souvenir sheets were used for the Skylab missions. Both are horizontal format, printed bi-color and contain nine 6¢ locals. Type "A" illustrates the Skylab and was used on numbers SL-1-NLP, SL-4-NLP and SL-6-NLP. Type "B" illustrates the crew emblem of each of the three crews. It is used on SL-2-NLP, SL-3-NLP and SL-5-NLP.

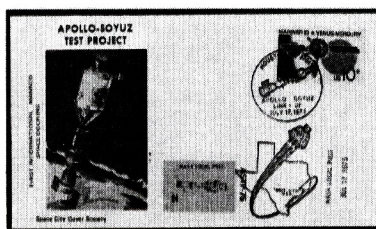
NOTE: For clarification, it should be remembered that Skylab 1 is the designation of the Orbiting Laboratory itself; Skylab 2 refers to the first crew of Conrad, Kerwin and Weitz; Skylab 3 refers to the second crew of Bean, Lousma and Garriott; and Skylab 4 refers to the third crew of Carr, Gibson and Pogue.

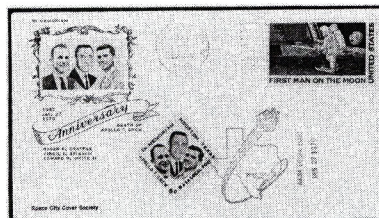
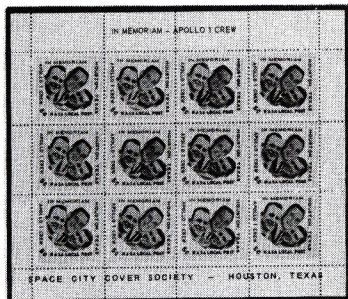


# SOUVENIR SHEETS:

There are two different types of souvenir sheets for the Apollo Soyuz Test Project. Both are horizontal format, printed bi-color, and each contains nine 6¢ locals. There is an inscription at top and bottom of the sheet. ASTP-1-NLP illustrates the ASTP emblem and ASTP-2-NLP illustrates the Apollo craft and Soyuz craft in a docked position.

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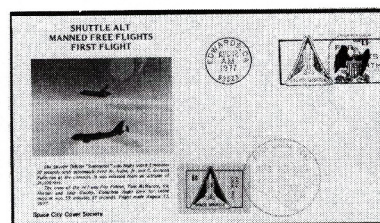
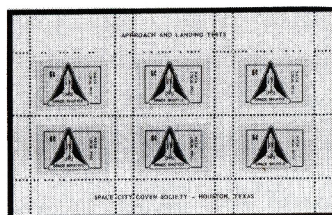
