



On January 16, 1978, thirty five astronaut trainees were selected to begin training at the Johnson Space Center in Houston. This was the first such group to be selected to train specifically for flights on the Space Shuttle missions.

The Space City Cover Society serviced a complete set of 35 covers; one for each of the selectees. As all of these became astronauts about one year later, this set of covers "tell it all." This is especially true since four of the astronauts in this group died in the tragic explosion of Challenger's 51-L flight. These four are McNair, Onizuka, Scobee, and Resnik.

Each cover in the set has a pair of the Apollo 15¢ commemoratives with the MPP hand cancel of January 16, 1978 (Houston). In addition, each cover has a NASA Local Post commemorative stamp, as there is a single stamp for each of the 35 individuals. These are cancelled with the NASA Local Post commemorative hand cancel.

The complete set of 35 covers is only \$32.50 and will be shipped out to you by return mail. This is less than one dollar each cover and even in today's market, a bargain.
