It carried a scaled-down model of the Shuttle Solid Rocket Booster airborne in preparation for a parachute drop test. When Space Shuttle is actually launched, the Shuttle Booster will be parachuted back to Earth. The first three covers in this series (Jun 10, 1977 a.m., Jun 10 p.m., and Jun 15) have been offered by us previously. Astronauts Dr. Owen K. Garriott and Dr. Robert A. Parker were selected on August 1, 1978 as Mission Specialists on the Spacelab 1 mission. That flight is planned for 7 days with about 40 experiments. Mission Specialists have the overall responsibility for the coordination, with the Commander and Pilot, of Space Shuttle operations. This cover is priced at 80¢.

It has been quite some time since we left off with the series of fifth anniversary covers for the Apollo flights. The last one we did was for Apollo 14.
