

STS-26 DISCOVERY'S FLIGHT... ... THE RE-BIRTH OF AMERICA'S SPACE PROGRAM Bulletin Special! LAUNCH DATE SET FOR SEPTEMBER 29, 1988

It is only a short time until launch of Discovery and this mission is being called "STS-26...A NEW BEGINNING." Space Shuttle Discovery is on the launch pad and all things are go. The new booster rockets are working in a superior fashion, after a complete revision in design as a result of the Challenger tragedy. And the new shuttle engines are performing in excess of the tolerance needed for an actual flight.

Not only will the crew of Discovery launch a Tracking and Data Relay Satellite from the cargo bay during the mission but their work also includes 12 in-flight experiments. But the two overriding goals are to revive the shuttle program and prove the extensively modified Discovery is fit to fly.

The crew's formal pre-flight press conference was held at the Johnson Space Center on August 22, 1988. The main theme voiced by the five crew members was, "The nation and NASA must be willing to accept the risks of space flight, which NASA now says are greater than estimated by the agency before the Challenger accident. This must be done if the U. S. is to maintain its technological pro-

Frederick Hauck, who will command the five-man crew said, "I'm very concerned about folks who feel we ought not to take risks. We might as well find out who is going to lead the world and then follow them. And we must remember that technology is the seed corn of the future.

STS-26 MISSION

The five crew members have trained 50 to 60 hours a week for one and a half years for this mission that is to last four days. It will launch from the Kennedy Space Center and land at Edwards Air Force Base in California. The entire flight will be controlled by Shuttle Mission Control at the Johnson Space Center in Houston.

SCCS MISSION COVERS...As in the past missions for Space Shuttle we will produce covers from all three mission sites. The launch cover will be cancelled at the Kennedy Space Center and the landing cover at Edwards, California. These two will be offered as a set.

For Houston, we will have two different sets. One with a launch and landing cover (one for each of the two events) with a Houston machine cancel on the correct dates. The other set of two will have the Houston Mailer's Permit Postmark hand cancel.

TDRS LAUNCH COVER...During the flight the crew will launch the Tracking and Data Relay Satellite from Discovery's cargo bay, upon instruction from Mission Control in Houston. We will have a cover on that date cancelled with the Houston MPP hand cancel.

DOUBLE CANCELLED COVER...On January 28, 1986, when Challenger exploded, the U. S. manned space program came to a halt. And that halt has lasted nearly three years. But with a successful launch of STS-26 that picture will change. From the ending (January 26, 1986) to the new beginning (launch of STS-26) these two historic events will be commemorated by an SCCS double cancelled cover.

We will use a few of our remaining 51-L covers (January 28, 1986), apply a 25¢ stamp to them and have those cancelled on launch date of STS-26. Even though the single cover of January 28, 1986 is already selling for around \$5.00 we are going to make a special price to all that order this 1986 double cancelled cover from this order form only. And the price will be only \$3.75 Both cancels will be the desirable Houston MPP hand cancel.

OTHER STS-26 COVERS

AUGUST 22, 1988 PRESS CONFERENCE...As mentioned in the beginning of this bulletin, this was held at JSC. Our cover for this <u>pre-flight</u> press conference is MPP hand cancelled Houston and priced at only \$1.50 each.

CREW LEAVES FOR LAUNCH SITE AND LAUNCH... This cover will be MPP hand cancelled Houston on the date the five leave JSC for Canaveral and the STS-26 launch. Price of \$1.50

CREW ARRIVES HOME AFTER LANDING OF THE MISSION... This cover will be MPP hand cancelled Houston on the date the five crew members arrive back in Houston after the completion of the STS-26 mission. The price is \$1.50
